
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

- 3.1 The recipients of Category 1 education promotion scholarships (full scholarships) must obtain a cumulative grade point average for each semester of not less than 3.50 to be eligible for semester personal allowance. If the cumulative grade point average is below 3.50, they are not eligible for personal expenses support. However, if the cumulative grade point average is not lower than 3.30, all tuition fees will be waived. If they receive a cumulative grade point average of less than 3.30 in any semester, they will not be eligible for the scholarship.
- 3.2 The recipients of Categories 2 and 3 education promotion scholarships must obtain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.30° in each semester. If they receive a cumulative grade point average below the specified threshold in any semester, they will not be eligible for the scholarship.
